

DIRECTIONS TO SC NATIONAL GUARD ARMORY

From Charleston:

Take I-26 West to Columbia. As you approach Columbia, take I-77 toward Charlotte. From I-77, take Exit 5 for Bluff Rd. Make a left on Bluff Rd. Go 2-3 miles and the Armory is on the left. It is a brick building with a granite sign near the road that says T. Eston Marchant National Guard Complex.

From Downtown Columbia:

Take Assembly St. toward Williams-Brice Stadium. As you pass the Fair Grounds, continue on Assembly as it turns into George Rogers Blvd. You will see the stadium on your left and at the light, make a left on Bluff Rd. The Armory is on the right a few blocks pass the Farmers Market and the USC practice field. It is a brick building with a granite sign near the road that says T. Eston Marchant National Guard Complex.

From Florence/Myrtle Beach:

Take I-20 toward Augusta. Once in Columbia, take I-77 toward Charleston. From I-77, take Exit 5 for Bluff Rd. Make a right on Bluff Rd. Go 2-3 miles and the Armory is on the left. It is a brick building with a granite sign near the road that says T. Eston Marchant National Guard Complex.

From Greenville/Spartanburg:

Take I-26 East to Columbia. Once in Columbia, remain on I-26 toward Charleston at the I-26/I-126 split. Continue on I-26 for 5-8 miles then take I-77 toward Charlotte. From I-77, take Exit 5 for Bluff Rd. Make a left on Bluff Rd. Go 2-3 miles and the Armory is on the left. It is a brick building with a granite sign near the road that says T. Eston Marchant National Guard Complex.

From Sumter/Myrtle Beach: Take Hwy. 378 to Columbia. When you get into East Columbia, look for the Sears Shopping Center on your left. Pass the shopping center and at the first light, make a left on Atlas Rd. next to McDonald's. Continue on Atlas Rd. Cross over the intersection at Atlas Rd. and Shop Rd. The next major intersection will be Atlas Rd. and Bluff Rd. Make a right on Bluff Rd. Go 3-4 miles and the Armory will be on the left. It is a brick building with a granite sign near the road that says T. Eston Marchant National Guard Complex.
